Box Tops (Monthly): "Box Tops for Education" donations are made throughout the year. Volunteers cut, sort, and submit donated box tops. One coordinator is needed for each school, other volunteers are helpful!

Spirit Wear (Fall): Orders are taken at the beginning of the school year for Mt. Zion Braves apparel. Volunteers assist with submitting, sorting, and distributing the orders.

Grandparent's Day (September): Grandparents are invited to the schools to visit the children. Volunteers escort grandparents and provide refreshment/hospitality.

Fall Festival (Pre K – 3rd, October): Carnival games and activities for children, silent auction, and food. Volunteers assist with planning, set up/tear down, games, or help with concessions.

Hospitality Committee (Monthly): Volunteers assist with planning a small treat or acknowledgement for our teachers each month in the lounge to show our appreciation.

You Rock! Club (Mt Zion Grade only – Quarterly): Reward activity for good behavior during the quarter for students. Volunteers help with games and activities.

Mother/Son Event (January): A mother/son event with games and activities. Volunteers help plan, set up/tear down, shifts to work games, ticket sales, refreshments at event.

Father/Daughter Dance (March): A father/daughter activity with pictures, dancing, and refreshments. Volunteers help plan, set up/tear down, work refreshments or ticket sales.

Play Day (Last week of School): A day of games and activities for children at all three schools to celebrate the end of the school year. Volunteers assist with planning activities, set up/tear down, shifts helping with games/activities.

Color Run (April): 5K and One Mile Color Run for the entire community. Volunteers assist with planning or activities during the event.

Teacher Appreciation Week (May): A week of treats, gifts, or activities for teachers and staff at all three schools. Volunteers assist with planning activities.

Spring Fling (Intermediate only, March): An evening with games, activities, and prizes for 4th – 6th graders. Volunteers assist with planning, set up/tear down, short shifts working games/activities.
